

What can I do as a 7th or 8th grade student to get a jump start on dual credit?

- Review the [6-year plan](#) that you have created with our guidance counselor. Are there high school requirements that you could take as a junior high student? (Example: take high school-level Health or Keyboarding online at home or during the summer)
- Aim to take one to three high school classes before your freshman year if you want to maximize the number of college courses you can take in high school as a junior or senior.
- IMPORTANT: if Fast Forward funds are used to pay for overload courses, those courses must be put on the high school transcript (i.e. the student's high school GPA "counts" as soon as they begin taking courses.)

What can I do as a 9th or 10th grade student to get ready for or begin dual credit?

- Maintain a 3.0 GPA; this is the minimum required to participate.
- Continue to take overload classes or double-up in high school subjects in order to complete high school requirements early (i.e. students that excel in math could take two math classes as a freshman.)
- 10th graders that have excellent grades can be approved for dual credit electives on a case-by-case basis. Students will be advised based on their interests and degree goals. The [GEM courses](#) are a good place to begin.
- Look at dual credit options taught by Wallace teachers (i.e. ART 111 with Mrs. Lund counts as a high school requirement and college humanities course.)
- Students that would like to be considered for Valedictorian or Salutatorian should pay careful attention to the requirements outlined in the [student handbook](#). Core subjects (math, science, social studies, English) offered at Wallace must be taken from Wallace instructors.

What are the dual credit courses available to me as an 11th or 12th grader?

- Dual credit courses include: ART 111 & 122 with Mrs. Lund, [IDLA courses](#), and [North Idaho College](#) online courses.
- All courses must be pre-approved before they will go on a high school transcript, so make sure to discuss options with your counselor.

- Juniors should check their SAT scores to see if they are eligible to take Math and English as dual credit courses in their Senior year.

How will my courses transfer to my college or university?

- Seniors need to remember to request transcripts to transfer completed courses to the institution they will attend.
