**Areas of Successes:** K-3 IRI scores continue to grow near or equal to performance targets. Kindergarten growth from fall to spring, as measured by the IRI, shows that students not proficient on the fall assessment continue to grow throughout the school year. 3rd grade students continue to score above the state average on the ISAT ELA and Math assessment.

**Areas of Challenge:** eventhough our ISAT assessment scores are near our performance targets overall levels of proficiency in grades 4-6 continue to be below the state average. ISAT proficiency rates at the 7-10 continues to be below the state average in both ELA and Math. However, math results are significantly lower than the staet average.

**Plans to Build on Success/Address Challenges:** at the elementary there is a focus on math fluency/computation and ELO review to varify validity of curriculum. WJSH students will continue to focus on their learning plans, FASFA completion, and post secondary applications.
